講義計画						

In the first week, students will be given the opportunity to get to know the teacher and other members of the class via icebreaking activities. The students and teacher will work together to come up with a set of classroom rules and regulations.

The following weeks in the semester will adopt a task-based approach to language learning. Task will be primarily aimed at improving students' oral and general English speaking skills. Students will have a certain amount of autonomy in choosing tasks. Care will be taken to ensure that the students have a variety of interesting tasks aimed at improving, accuracy, fluency, complexity of language and motivation. In particular, selected tasks will: (1) provide lots of meaningful input; (2) promote accuracy and complexity of students' output; (3) focus on form; and (4) increase fluency.

Tasks will also be chosen to help students in areas of particular weaknesses.

Depending on the students' interests and other pragmatic reasons, there may be some deviations from the course schedule outlined below.

Week 1	In this class, students will gain an orientation regarding the course objectives. Learners will participate in group activities.	Long time no see. Week 3	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Festivals and holidays. Students will learn more about festivals that take place throughout the world. Time clauses using before, after and when will also be explored. Students will gain the opportunity to present a festival from their own or a foreign country.		
Week 4	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Folklore and fairy tales will be presented and discussed. Differences in pronunciation of common words will be highlighted and practised. Speaking strategies surrounding conversations about movies will be presented. The past continuous tense will be highlighted and practised		
Week 5	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Today we will learn lots of vocabulary to describe people's personality. Students will participate in reading and writing activities. Students will participate in pair activities to develop fluency.		
Week 6	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	The workplace. In this lesson, we will discuss different types of jobs and the personality characteristics that people need to successfully do these jobs. Students will learn speaking strategies to discuss their abilities and limitations. Learners will also practice using the present perfect tense when using since "and" "for"."		
Week 7	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Dream jobs, Students will learn collocations related to jobs, Students will discuss jobs that they would like to do and why they would like to do them. They will learn more vocabulary related to people's personality. Learners will how to produce job descriptions.		
Week 8	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Using the telephone. Students will learn vocabulary related to using telephones. Students will learn how to pronounce telephone numbers and learn speaking strategies for speaking on the telephone. Students will also practice modal expressions and participate in role play exercises.		

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Week 9	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	The latest cell phones. Students will learn vocabulary for the features and functions of cell phones. Students will also gain the opportunity to discuss their feelings about cell phones. Students will also give their opinions on whether or not children should have access to cell phones.		
Week 10	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Technology and computers. Students will learn vocabulary related to computers and explore the problems and merits of owning a computer. Students will learn speaking skills that indicate they are interested in something.		
Week 11	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Innovations in technology. Students will explore how to describe products and discuss the usefulness of various items of technology. Products that are being produced for the future will be also explored and discussed.		
Week 12	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Planning a trip. Students will learn vocabulary and collocations related planning a trip. Students will learn speaking strategies related to forgetting items. Students will also use modal verbs to indicate necessity.		
Week 13	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Exploring, adventure and travel. Students will learn words related to domestic and overseas travel. Students will discuss their feelings about travelling and whether or not the prefer to travel with companions or alone.		
Week 14	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Bringing everything together. Today, we will practice and demonstrate that we can use many of the structures that were learned this semester.		
Week 15	Four skills (reading writing listening and speaking), vocabulary, grammar, and fluency activities.	Looking to the future. Students will be entering their final year after the vacation. We will discuss out plans for the vacation, and their strategies for looking for work, or a place at a graduate school.
